Heather Givans took us along with her as she retold her journey of fabric design. We learned how she went from Purdue student to fabric designer by way of teaching art. Her laugh inspired most of us to do more with our creativity. She made us understand that from our tears of frustration when something doesn't come when we want it, success or joy will come in the morning. Tears are part of the process.

Through her journey, we learned of her side business, Harriet's headbands. She taught us to follow our creative thoughts and see where they lead us. Heather reminded us when we are given lemons to make lemonade. The young men in her advisory group turned a hobby for her into a lucrative business while she followed the principal's directive to teach her students. We learned of her ups and downs in designing fabric. We were able to see how the finished

designs were used both in quilting and in garment sewing.

One of the most interesting facts shared, was although she owns a quilt shop on Mass Ave in Indianapolis, she is NOT A QUILTER. She designs the fabric and someone else makes use of the fabric.

She explained her fabric usually has only one run of about 3000 yards. Once it is gone, it is gone. She makes up kits for projects the way she thinks the fabrics should be used. So if you buy a pattern, and don't purchase the fabric she has for it at that time, you probably won't be able to find the fabric later. That was new information for this writer.

Because she demonstrated both quilts and garments in her slides, I hope you will agree that Heather had something for everyone who attended our 2019 annual meeting.

Heather was generous with her door prize contributions for our ASG guild. Please support her shop.

Liberty of London Or What I did On My Summer Vacation

My husband and I recently went to London for our vacation. Believe it or not, Liberty of London is actually mentioned in some travel books, so we decided to visit the store that heretofore had only been a magazine advertisement to me.

I was surprised to learn that Liberty is really a department store that just happens to sell fabric and notions on a floor within the store.

There were store clerks eagerly waiting everywhere to help the customers. Haute couture fabrics abounded. I saw my first bolt of Cashmere fabric; there were walls of silks, cottons, wools, bridal fabrics and synthetics. I especially lingered over the table of buttons made from polished stone, leather, and bone.

Did I come back with a suitcase full of fabric? No. Even though, I did take a suitcase for that purpose. Why not? The British pound is worth about twice an American dollar. Why pay \$40-\$50 dollars a yard for Ultrasuede when I can get it cheaper in the States?

I must explain that the European countries have a Value Added Tax (V.A.T.) of 8%-17% on all services or purchases. As a traveler, the V.A.T. is expensive unless you fill out a form for a refund before you leave the country.

All in all, we enjoyed our visit to Liberty of London; it was enlightening. The visit also made me appreciate how well-stocked our own stores are here in the Midwest. The grass isn't always greener, I found out.

FASTFORWARD TO 2020

The above article appeared in the Stitching Line over 25 years ago. Have there been any changes? Absolutely!

The standard Value Added Tax (VAT) in the United Kingdom increased four times since 1992. The last increase occurred in 2011 resulting in a 20% standard rate.

Liberty of London sells fabric and they are still in business! I can name a few Midwest fabric stores that no longer exist, such as Hancock's, Cloth World, Something Wonderful, Baer Fabrics, The Fashion Sewing Shop, Minnesota Fabrics, Sew What Fabrics, Stretch and Sew Fabric, So-Fro Fabrics and the Village Fabric Shop. Perhaps, you remember shopping at those stores or other stores that weren't listed.

I love sewing with Ultrasuede so I went online "snooping" to compare current day prices. The store that I'm very familiar with is Field's Fabrics which has seven stores located in the Grand Rapids, Michigan area. Their price range was between \$37 to \$53 dollars a yard including solids, animal prints and other designs. Field's Fabrics claims to have the largest inventory of Ultrasuede in the Midwest! I highly recommend Field's for all fabrics. My next online stop was Amazon.com where the price range was between \$40 to \$100 dollars a yard. I was only able to locate solid colors on Amazon's website.

I hope you agree that the Midwest still has green grass!



American Sewing Guild Indianapolis Chapter 2019 Annual Meeting Survey Results summary

Twenty (20) of the twenty-eight (28) neighborhood groups were represented at the 2019 annual meeting this year. Most of the attendees have attended ten(10) or more meetings during the year. The group still favors garment sewing over quilting or any other type of sewing. The group still likes the current venue, food, and start time. Only one person responded no to this question.

When asked about a speaker, Linda Lee, a sewing blogger, quick points ruler owner, or Louise Cutting were mentioned. Shops hops, Lets Sew, Silk Road, and Vogue fabrics in Evanston, Shipshewana and an overnight shop hop in southern IN were suggested. Nineteen (19)attendees would consider an overnight stay. Some suggested places are Mode Vogue Novi, MI Evansville.

Only one person does not read the stitching line. After much hard work, we can finally report the majority of responders are on Group Works. Twenty- seven members have logged on to the web site in the last 6 months. With those numbers, this writer is surprised to learn the minority of members are on our Facebook page. Members want to learn about Community Service; Membership; Neighborhood Group communication; help with Special Events; Education; Website; Social Media; Stitching Line.

These items will give the CAB agenda items for the coming year. Keep an eye out for the president's message to address these issues and more during the coming year. Feel free to contact Darlene Sipes if you are interested in helping in any capacity.

Below are ALL of the comments written on the surveys.

New Start time is great; Food is good; Like the old time better; very much; Darlene makes me be here at 9:00-just kidding; very nice; fine; too much time with nothing to do move things along; ok absolutely; The stitching line is not read because too busy working; seldom; not often.

Regarding Group works;

I have signed on but do not use. I forget about it. I don't know how Didn't know about it I don't have much success finding anything on group works trouble signing in on it twice too busy working in process, can't open One person said I don't know how to log on to the web site

Non Facebook users responded with: Not on Facebook; I don't know how; dislike Facebook; not on Facebook much; not a Facebook participant; no account; rarely on Facebook; do not do Facebook; hard for me to use computer; not computer savvy; I forget; no reason; stopped using FaceBook and no computer.

Thoughts in General included

I have been thinking of you guys! The gowns you all spend so much time on have been blessing our patients in some amazing ways!

We had a patient on our unit who was such a spark of light! She was young and beautiful, spunky, outgoing, friendly, and her family & friends loved her dearly. When the time was drawing close to her transition, her friends asked our nurses if we had anything else that she could wear in her last moments here. The nurses came to me right away and as I heard, I took a moment and said a prayer. I went through the gowns and silently asked which one was meant for her. I felt drawn to a beautiful, vibrant rainbow gown with purples and pinks and blues and rushed it over to the unit. The nurse smiled and said that it was the right one for the patient and that it fit her personality perfectly. Her family and friends thanked us with tears in their eyes.

Our patient stepped from this world into the next wearing something that was made with love, something that was dignified, pretty, and oh so perfect.

I was approached by a social worker at one of our team meetings. She was asking me if there was "any chance" one of her patients could have a couple of gowns. The patient had very little and the family had been cutting her nightgowns so they could work around her clothing. I rushed back to the Volunteer Services office, said a little prayer, and gathered up three gowns. When I gave them to the social worker, she had tears in her eyes and said, "How did you know?" I just smiled and said that it was the love and magic that came with the gowns and that I felt drawn to certain gowns for each patient request.

We had a male patient who needed both a gown and a blanket. So, of course, I said my prayer and found a blanket with antlers and a gown and pillowcase that matched almost perfectly. It was another small miracle!

My days working in hospice are made up of a myriad of tiny miracles. But the effect of any miracle is far-reaching and ripples out into the world like tiny sparks of light that show us the way. The most significant miracles that I see are the ones resulting from our own acts of kindness and compassion that are born from our deep love for one an-

other. That deep, unconditional love for a total stranger is a miracle in itself. And it's what drives you and my favorite team of the ASG to deliver something that we never knew we needed.

When I can present a gown, I am presenting a thing of beauty. I am acting as your arms as you reach out to touch another person, another heart, another soul.

Thank you for the beauty of your gifts, the sacred tenderness of your kindness, and for the love you have sewn into each gown with every single stitch. If we all knew how much love was packaged in each of those Ziploc bags, we would understand that a little piece of heaven can actually be contained. •And shared. :)

Thank you for the hours you spend purchasing and measuring fabric, cutting that fabric, folding...pinning...stitching...sewing.

Thank you to each and every one of you who sits at a machine for hours.

Thank you for suffering each pin prick that accidentally finds your fingers.

Thank you for your beautiful, guided hands who create such tangible love.

Thank you for your eyes that strain to see when threading that needle.

Thank you for your late nights and early mornings.

But most of all, thank you for infusing prayer and love into every single stitch.

May you feel all of that love and magic and dedication circle back to you in some form or fashion.

And as much as I wish you could be with me to witness all these moments of miracles, I want you to know that you are all in my heart. Every. Single. Day.
